

2016 Texas Shellers' Jamboree Exhibit Information

- Exhibits are for single shells only. Only one entry per scientific category is allowed. All shells in the exhibits must belong to the exhibitor and may be self-collected or purchased. Exhibits should have scientific labeling. A small red dot may be used to show a shell is self-collected.
- 2. Exhibits are limited to 12" unless prior approval has been given by the Jamboree committee.
- 3. Exhibitors must provide a case to display their exhibit.
- 4. The show will be set up in the museum on Saturday, April 23, at 9:00 a.m. All exhibits must be set up by 10:00, when the museum opens to the public. Scientific judging will begin at 10:30. Voting slips for The Yellow Rose award will be in the registration packets.
- 5. Exhibits will remain on display until after the banquet Saturday night. (All exhibits must be removed Saturday night as there are no events planned at the Center on Sunday.)
- 6. Awards will be given at the banquet on Saturday.

Categories

- 1. Texas State Shell: an exhibit of a single Lightning Whelk
- 2. Texas Marine Shell: an exhibit of one marine shell from Texas Waters (up to 500 yards off Texas beaches)
- 3. Texas Fossil Shell: an exhibit of one fossil collected in Texas
- 4. Texas Freshwater or Land Shell: an exhibit of one freshwater OR land shell
- 5. Gulf of Mexico: an exhibit of a single shell from beyond 500 yards off Texas beaches
- 6. Worldwide Marine Shell: an exhibit of one marine shell from anywhere in the world
- 7. Worldwide Fossil Shell: an exhibit of a single fossil from anywhere in the world
- 8. Worldwide Freshwater or Land Shell: an exhibit of one freshwater OR land shell from anywhere in the world
- 9. Shell Craft: anything made or decorated with shells
- 10. Junior: an exhibit of one shell by a sheller under 16 years of age
